Certification Program Requirements:

- Applicant selects an approved course topic in any of the four pillars of the program (safety, security emergency management, risk management)
- Applicants submit the course synopsis and learning outcomes to AARMSS Committee
- Course is reviewed and approved by AARMSS Committee
- Applicant is assigned a mentor based on AARMSS Committee recommendation
- Applicant meets with mentor a minimum of three times:
 - Present outline of presentation to mentor
 - o Present first draft of presentation
 - o Present final draft of presentation
- Present course at AIMS International Safety Seminar to a panel of AARMSS Committee members and AARMSS students
- AARMSS Committee members critique the presentation and provide feedback to the applicant
- Successful applicants are awarded the CASSP certification
- Unsuccessful applicants must refine their presentation and present at a future AIMS International Safety
 Seminar

Renewal Requirements:

- CASSP certification renewal period is 2 years
- CASSP certificate holders must apply for renewal, pay the renewal fee and show a total of 4.0 CEUs earned within the 2-year renewal period
- CASSP certificate holders must volunteer for an AIMS event/program at least once per renewal period. Examples of volunteer work include:
 - o Teaching courses at the safety seminar
 - Serving on a committee
 - Writing an article on a safety topic for the Amusement Today AIMS monthly column
 - o Being a track coordinator for the education program
 - o Serving as a proctor for certification testing at the safety seminar or other regional outreach events
